## Weiser boys look to improve in 2021-22

#### With 19 years coaching experience Schultz takes helm after Adolfson departure

The Weiser boys' basketball team qualified for a 3A State play-in game in 2021, the Wolverines are looking to take the next step in 2021-22, according to first year varsity head coach Chris Schultz.

Schultz got his start as an assistant at Treasure Valley Community College in Ontario and has served as the Weiser freshman boys head coach for the last two years. He coached the JV girls basketball team for six years prior to that.

He said that although the varsity has lost some key players from last season, there are experienced and talented athletes returning.

Brett Spencer, Willy Shirts, and Evan Haggerty are three of those players.

their teammates, are just coming off a 3A Idaho State Championship football season and have little time to make the transition to the basketball court.

Schultz said they are the kind of guys, however, that don't necessarily need a lot of time and will be ready for the Wolverines' season opener on Dec. 1, at home against Melba.

All the players on the roster will be used in multiple capacities, especially Spencer, who was a First-Team All-Conference pick last season.

"Brett is going to play a little bit of everything, Schultz said. "In the past, he's played a lot of guard, but we are going to use him everywhere."

Schultz said Shirts and The athletes, like most of Haggerty will both spend time at wing and post.

He added that there is good talent coming up from the ranks to fill the voids left by last year's graduates.

"We lost Eli Ruiz, Ray Calley, and Sam Kerner, and there was also Tyler Pope," Schultz said. "With that said, we have a great group of young guys coming up."

Jack Shirts, Brock Spencer, and Carter Jensen all played on Weiser's freshman team last year and are expected to make good contributions to the varsity team this season. The freshmen went undefeated and won the district championship in 2021. Schultz hopes that experience will carry forward as sopho-

to get big minutes and actually challenge some of those returners for starting spots," Schultz said. "We have a fourth one, Braden Phillips (sophomore), who will split time on both the JV and varsity to start. If he develops the way I think he can, he will really add to the mix. He's a big man and we are working on his speed and footwork, but by the end of the season, I see him playing varsity fulltime.'

Offensively, says his players won't get too comfortable playing just one position.

"If you've noticed, we aren't very tall, but we are quick," he said. "We've got speed and quickness, so on offense, we are going to spread the floor out, (2015, 2017).

Schultz, now in his 19th year as a coach, takes over the helm for former head coach Brad Adolfson who was named head coach at 4A Nampa High School in May.

While at Weiser, Adolfson recorded a 114-80 record, leading his teams to two conference championships (2016, 2017) and two district championships



## Tri-Valley girls reloading in defense of state championship

Springer expects *Tri-Valley Titans* to be competitive in 2021-22

The Tri-Valley girls' varsity basketball team has been in the state championship mix for the last two years.

In 2019-20, the Titans went 23-3 overall and 11-0 in league play, losing 55-48 to Carey in a 1A state championship semi-final game that left them fighting Salmon River over third place. They beat the Savages 45-43 to end the season third. Carey ultimately fell to Rockland 45-30 in the state championship.

In 2020-21, Tri-Valley amassed another impressive season, going 21-3 overall and 10-0 in league, according to MaxPreps.com. This

time, they captured the 1A Div. II Idaho State Championship, beating Kendrick (20-6) 54-48.

So, what will become of 2021-22?

Despite losing four senior starters, third-vear coach Jeff Springer told the Weiser Signal American that he believes his team will nonetheless be competitive.

That was over two weeks ago, before he had finalized his varsity roster.

Since that time, Tri-Valley has beaten Greenleaf Friends Academy (1-3) by a score of 34-24 on Nov. 16 and Compass Honors (0-3) 78-22 on Nov. 18. The Titans fell 52-37 to 2A New Plymouth (1-2) on Nov. 19 in the team's first loss of the season.

"They are two divisions higher than us, but I think we could have beat them," Springer said of New Plymouth.

But it's early in the year and Springer is working on getting his new lineup working together. Once the team's combination of experience and youth begin to gel, the Titans could very well see success.

The bad news: Springer loses five seniors from last season, including First-Team All-State picks Josey Jones and Emma Hollon.

The good news: the Titans return four players with varsity experience. They are juniors Hadley Atnip, Maren Hansen, and Manon Tyler, and senior Abigale Atnip.

"They didn't get a lot of minutes, but they do have varsity experience," Springer said. "They will be varsity players again and we will add some freshmen to the mix. We do have a fabulous freshman class and by the end of the year, some of them will probably be playing some pretty big minutes."

Freshmen Emma McKee-Barton, Stella Warren, and Hunter Hastie have seen playing time in the Titans' first three games. Another freshman, Cloe Russell, also appears on the varsity roster. "There are also a couple of sophomores I let suit up as freshmen when we went to state last year," Springer said. "They may be playing both JV and varsity.'

Those sophomores are Tyler Gressley and Becca Chandler.

"All these girls have great work ethic, and they are excited to be here," Springer said. "I have high expectations for them. I truly believe we are going to be competitive."

Springer said that Council appears to be the league favorite, at least for the moment. The Lumberjacks have a new coach, former Salmon River head coach Paula Tucker.

"She has had a huge amount of success," Springer said. "She was at Salmon River for a number of years and Garden Valley before that. She knows her stuff and she's got a lot of talent

League opponents include Council, Cascade, Garden Valley, Horseshoe Bend, Meadows Valley, Riverstone, Salmon River, and Tri-Valley.

## Titan wrestling team ready to hit mat

The wrestling program in Midvale and Cambridge began as a club sport and evolved into a school district-sanctioned junior high program. When Russell became a freshman in high school, his father Nathan and his two fellow coaches, Mark Moura and Jake Waggoner, knew it was time to ramp things up.

It's just how the trio – there is no "head coach" per se - envisioned things evolving.

"All three of us, and all of the kids involved, just kind of came up through the club program originally and then on to the junior high program. We've been working on this for about a decade," Noah said. "It was time to start the high school program last year because we had one kid, my son, who was ready to compete at the next level. He was going to be a freshman in high school, so we knew we had

Noah. "It's going to be fun and to get that program started betake that next step, too.'

As it stands, the Titan wrestling team has one senior, Adam Miller, a 138-pounder. The rest of the team of 10 athletes is comprised of juniors and sophomores. Many of them are in their second year as varsity wrestlers.

"Most of our kids with experience are coming up through the junior varsity right now," Noah said. "They have a bunch of kids that have wrestled for a long time. Next year, we'll have at least six eighth graders coming in, freshmen who have been wrestling since they've been five- or six-years-old."

Noah said starting a varsity wrestling program during the pandemic was challenging, but it didn't hold back their efforts and kids are taking advantage of the opportunity.

# Titans boys to rebuild in 2021-22

Area schools are making the transition from the gridiron to the basketball court, including athletes participating in the Tri-Valley boys' basketball program, which is expected to undergo a rebuilding season in 2021-22.

In Midvale and Cambridge, the Tri-Valley boys' combined basketball program began holding practices a few weeks ago under the direction of new coach Kylee Morris.

Morris, who also serves as the Midvale School District Superintendent, takes over as head coach this year, her first as boys varsity head coach.

"I'm originally from Midvale," she said. "I graduated here and then returned to the area in 2007."

Morris is a long-time basketball player and coach, having played for Walla Walla Community College. She received her bachelor's degree at Boise State University, her master's from Governors University, and her education degree from BSU.
